

ENCOUNTERING THE GOD WHO HEALS



Spaw's Paws

Some thoughts from your D.S., Rev. Mark E. Spaw

HERE'S TO DEEP ROOTS

It's time to start planting. So...what will we plant? What is the soil like? Will it need fertilizer, water, protection? I always get those hanging plants, pull the price tags off and my gardening for the season is done! I told you that to tell you this...

In one episode of the old Seinfeld TV show George is thinking about saying "I love you" to a woman he has been going out with. Jerry cautions him that that's a big step — because if you say "I love you" and don't get an "I love you" in return, what then? "That's a big matzo ball hanging out there," George's friend reminds him. If you know anything about that series, you know that as funny as it could be, you didn't usually get profound theological insights from it. But, in this case, that exchange really does tell us something important: Words are real and words do things. If you say, "I love you" — or for that matter, "I hate you" — those words are out there and can't be called back. Words that have been spoken aren't just passively "out there." They are active and change things.

The primary reason we come to church is to hear the word of God regularly, the word that calls us to repentance and promises absolution the word of life in Jesus Christ. That is the seed that is sown, the word that comes into our hearing. What kind of soil is that? Will the word just lie dormant and in our memories for a little while and then be forgotten? Will it provoke some brief enthusiasm, only to be drowned out by the other interests and concerns in life? Or will it take root and grow and bring forth the fruit of service to God and our neighbors?

The word is God's, and it is God who gives it growth. But to those who believe, God gives the ability to prepare them to hear the word rightly. This summer, be where the word is sown! Remove the rocks and thorns that keep the seed from growing and avoid the things that distract us from the word. And as you share the word, sow seeds of kindness, caring, patience, tolerance, understanding and love.

Our church lawn signs should read, "HEY YOU, COME TO CHURCH". This is for all of us. Take an active interest in the word and reflect prayerfully on it so that it can take deep roots.
